New York currently automatically arrests, tries and prosecutes all 16 and 17 year-olds as adults in the criminal justice system. Should New York raise the age of criminal responsibility? Why/why not? What, if any, actions will you take to support your viewpoint?

The age of criminal responsibility should be raised to 21. It is unconscionable that any youth should ever be tried as an adult. I would introduce legislation to that effect. This would include alternatives to incarceration and full funding for public schools, youth programs, and family services, so that youth are given a positive, enriching, nurturing environment from the start.

If elected. what would be your top policy or budget priority for children, youth and families in the 2017 legislative session?

Elimination of the stock transfer tax - which could return as much as 16 billion dollars per year to the state - and introducing a progressive tax system that would tax the wealthiest at a higher rate, would be a start for finding the necessary funding for support services.
