



Look Who is Doing Great Work in New Rochelle!



The Youth and Police Initiative (YPI) is a community-based policing intervention intended for urban police departments that are seeking to bring about positive changes in their relationships with local at-risk youth. Founded by NAFI, YPI engages both police officers and at-risk youth in an interactive training program that seeks to reduce crime, conflict and delin-

quency and prevent gang involvement among city teens experiencing conflict through creating mutual understanding and empathy. The YPI program was successfully introduced into the New Rochelle community through the cooperation and participation of the New Rochelle City Council, New Rochelle Police Department, My Brother's Keeper, The Boys and Girls Club the Youth Bureau and members of the faith based community. More than 120 youth took part, gaining an understanding of Police Officers as individuals, finding out how very similar their lives really are and how they are committed to doing their job. In October 2016, six Officers and two community representatives will receive their certification at a City Council event.
