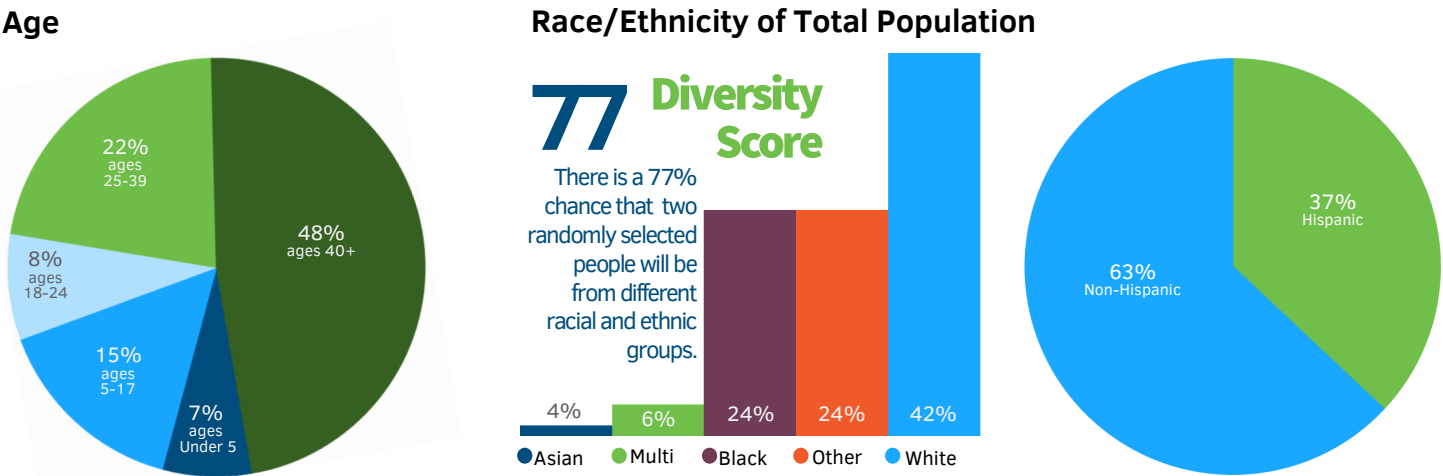

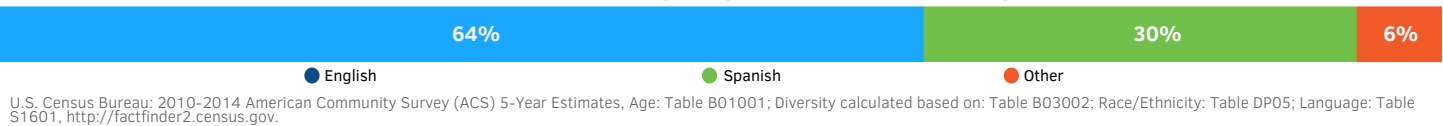


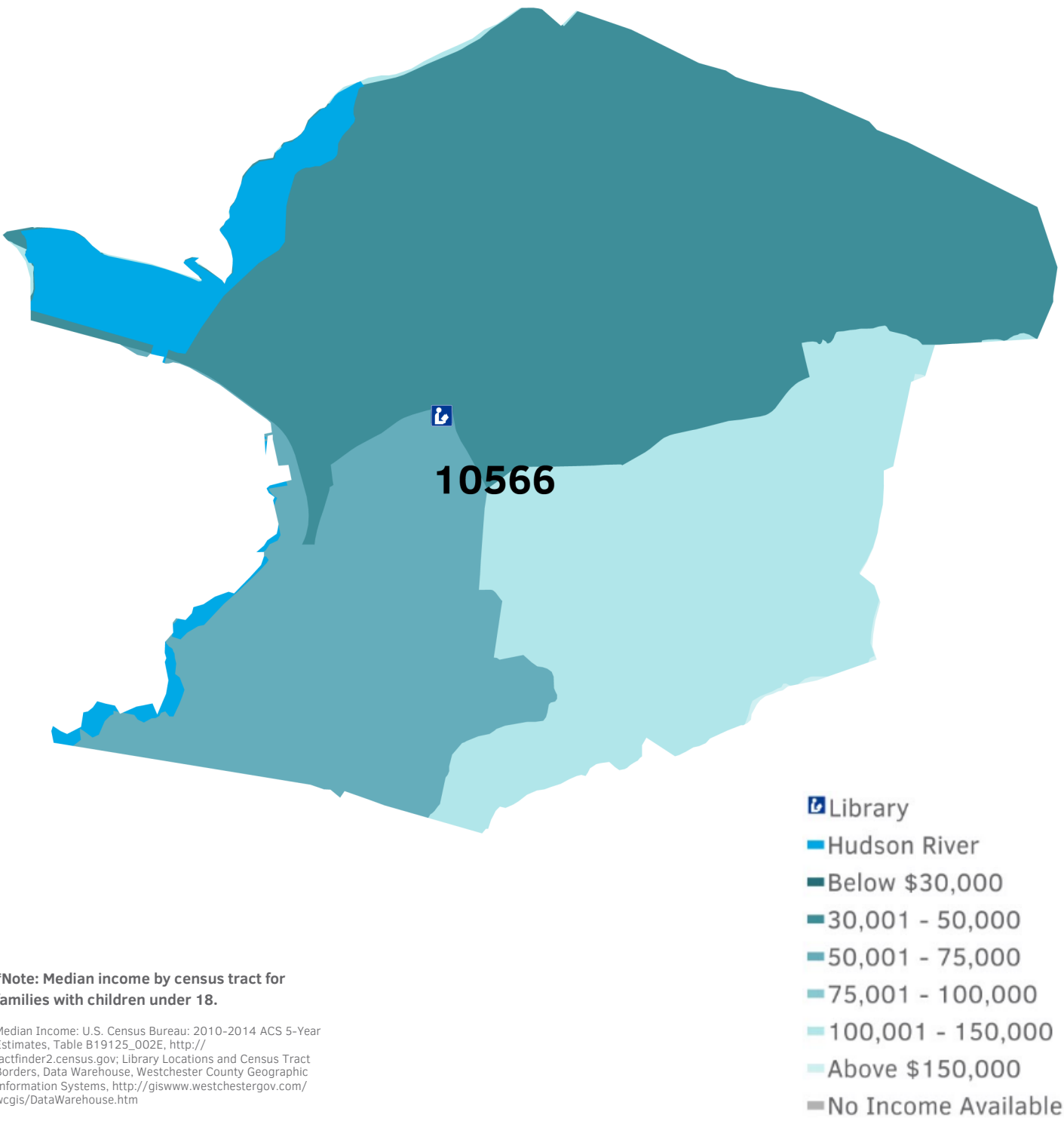

Look Who is Doing Great Work in Peekskill!

 The Peekskill Agencies Together (P.A.T.) Coalition has been in existence for well over a decade. Comprised of over 50 local and county agencies and organizations, its goals are to prevent and reduce youth substance use and abuse, bridge gaps in youth services, increase community communication and collaboration, and help to create an environment in which Peekskill youth can flourish. A sampling of specific services provided by the Coalition follows: monthly free produce distribution; trainings for local store managers regarding alcohol sales; school surveys regarding youth substance use; and information and referrals. What makes P.A.T. truly special is that virtually every agency in Peekskill that touches young people is at the table every month coordinating efforts and strategizing solutions.
