Building Partnerships that Help Kids Thrive

WCA convenes organizations and individuals to develop effective, collaborative approaches to meet children's critical needs.

For young children

- We mobilized 1,150 service providers, policy makers, and the public to support federal and state investment in Home Visiting - successfully preserving funding in the 2012 budget.
- As a partner with United Way of Westchester/Putnam's Thrive by 5 Initiative, we created a bilingual DVD featuring Born Learning Tips that encourage parents to use ordinary moments to teach words and concepts to their young children. The DVD was displayed in the waiting room of the Department of Health's White Plains office during June and July 2011 and will be expanded to other sites around the County where parents of young children gather.

For older youth

- We created and lead an inter-agency group of service providers focused on helping young people ages 16 to 24 maintain connection with school, employment and community.
- We produced Second Chances, a video that tells the story of disconnected and reconnected youth in their own voices.
- We have introduced and championed the Mayors' Action Challenge in Westchester, a national program that encourages local governments to meet youth needs.


Celebrating Victories for Children

Connecting Information with Insight

WCA is a key resource for the public, service providers and community leaders. We provide current data about our young people, timely updates on events and policies, and analysis that leads to practical, solutions to community problems.

- Through our web-based data resource, Children By the Numbers, we delivered comprehensive and timely information on Westchester's children to approximately 1,000 users in 2011.
- Users of our website requested more than 2,000 data points using our "Custom Reporting" tool and our "Fast Facts" tool. Data points are specific pieces of information that refer to a particular time period and location.
- We advised government and non-profit agencies about the importance and relevance of using demographic and outcome data in setting priorities, managing programs, and meeting the demand for measurable outcomes.
- Based, in part, on data we provided to the White Plains Youth Bureau, White Plains was deemed on of the 100 Best Communities for Youth in October by America's Promise Alliance.
- We acquired ArcGIS, a data analytical software package that allows us to map data geographically.
